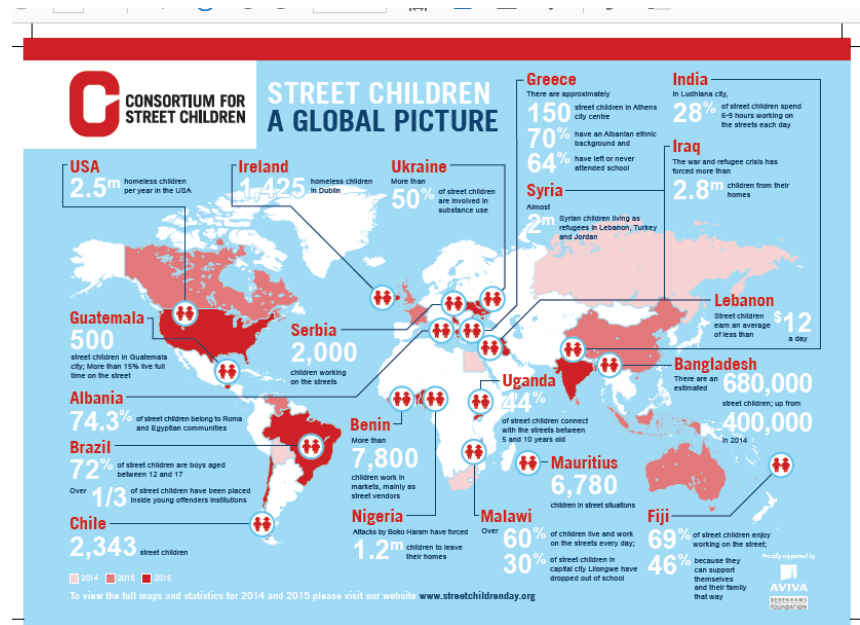
Children from all four schools got together to learn about Street Children and Children's Rights around the world.

## Selected articles from the UN Rights of the Child

- Article 3: Adults should do what is best for you.
- Article 6: You have the right to be alive.
- Article 14: You have the right to think what you like and be whatever religion you want to be
- Article 15: You have the right to make friends.
- Article 17: You have the right to collect information from radios, newspapers, television, books etc., from all around the world.
- Article 19: No one should hurt you in any way.
- Article 24: You have a right to good health.
- Article 27: You have the right to food, clothes, and a place to live.
- Article 28: You have a right to education.
- Article 30: You have the right to enjoy your own culture, practise your own religion and use your own language.
- Article 31: You have the right to play.
- Article 37: You should not be put in prison.
